### PROGRAMMATIC SUCCESSES

- Total number direct contacts impacts through programs, conferences, and trainings: 14,711
  - o 12,287 (84 %) youth and 552 adults (3 %) at K-12 Student Programs
  - o 14 (<1 %) at college level
  - o 818 (6 %) at Training & Professional Development
  - o 564 (4 %) at Community Engagement Events

- New products and resources
  - o <u>Leaf Pack Network simulation</u> for middle school students is now available on our <u>WikiWatershed</u> Toolkit
  - Aquatic macroinvertebrate identification app called '<u>Pocket Macros'</u> for both Android and Apple devices
  - Created and tested with 1900 students, a pilot virtual version of our 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>-grade field notebooks
  - New <u>Pennsylvania Gateway to Green website</u> created in collaboration with Pa Department of Education
- PA Environment and Ecology Standards for K-12 Learning. Dr. Kerlin was selected and is serving on the content writing committee updating the new proposed standards, which will now include a new domain of standards called Environmental Literacy and Sustainability.
- Obtained funding from **10** funding entities for our new Watershed Education Mobile Lab (see pg. 2 top for image) which will bring educational programming to students, families, and community members that have access challenges with transportation, funding, and limited technology connections.
